TOKYO GLOBAL INNOVATION CHALLENGE FAQ

- Who is eligible to apply?
- Undergraduate and graduate students currently enrolled at universities are eligible. Students enrolled in correspondence education programs are not eligible.
- Can I apply from overseas?
- Yes, you can apply from overseas. However, if selected as a finalist, you will need to come to Tokyo at your own expense.
- Can I add a friend who is good at English presentations to my team?
- A Yes, that's fine. However, you cannot add members during the competition, nor can you add substitute members if someone is unable to attend. Please include all team members when you initially apply.
- Can students from different universities form a team together?
- A Yes, that's perfectly fine.
- Can I apply with the same business plan I submitted to another contest?
- Yes, you can apply with a business plan that has been previously published in other business contest. Please indicate your publication history in the entry form when applying.
- Can I submit entries in languages other than English?
- A Entries must be in English only.
- Are business plans for ventures I'm already operating eligible for the contest?
- A No. This competition targets business plans that are still in the prelaunch phase and have not yet been implemented as active businesses.

TOKYO GLOBAL INNOVATION CHALLENGE

- Can one person participate in multiple teams?
- No, participation in multiple teams is not allowed. Please participate in only one team.
- Can I submit multiple entries with different business plans?
- Only one entry per team is allowed.
- Q How many teams can advance to the finals?
- We plan for 10 teams to advance to the finals, depending on the number of applications received.
- What do winners receive?
- The winning team will receive prize (total amount of prize is ¥1,000,000). Various awards are also prepared for all finalist teams.
- Who are the judges for the preliminary screening and contest finals?
- The preliminary screening is conducted by the "TOKYO GLOBAL INNOVATION CHALLENGE Executive Committee." The contest finals are judged by the following three types of judges:
 - Experts affiliated with universities and research institutions
 - Startup founders and business leaders
 - Venture capital investors
